

**CITY OF ANNA MARIA**  
**STATE OF EMERGENCY – COVID-19**  
**ORDER # 42**  
**REQUIRING FACEMASK USE AND SOCIAL DISTANCING**

**Beginning 8:00 a.m. 7/17/20 for a period of seven (7) days unless extended**

Pursuant to the authority vested in me as the Mayor of Anna Maria by the City Commission of the City of Anna Maria, in accordance with City of Anna Maria, Florida, Resolution No. R20-759, Amended Declaration (Proclamation) of Emergency, (“Declaration”) approved March 26, 2020, and in a further effort to reduce the potential spread of the deadly COVID-19, I hereby declare that every person working, living, visiting , or doing business in the City of Anna Maria shall properly wear a face covering in any indoor location, other than their home or residence, and to maintain social distancing from other person(s), excluding family members or companions. In addition, businesses are requested to strongly encourage face coverings and social distancing for customers and persons waiting in line out-doors for service. Also, Vacation Rental owners and management companies are requested to give out informational material, such as a copy of this order, to each of their vacation rental customers upon check-in. Facial coverings are not required to be worn by the following persons:

- Persons under the age of two
- Persons for whom a face covering would cause impairment due to an existing health condition
- Persons working in a business or profession who do not have interactions with other persons
- Persons working in an office when all interactions with others is done with social distancing as recommended by the CDC
- Persons while eating and/or drinking at a restaurant; provided, however face coverings must otherwise be worn in restaurants
- Persons while exercising and social distancing at fitness centers

Violations of this order shall be punished by a fine of \$50 per violation assessed against a person not wearing a face mask properly covering mouth and nose when required.

This Order shall be reviewed by the undersigned to determine whether it is needed to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Anna Maria no less often than once every seven (7) days, and if deemed to be still needed, shall be extended for additional period(s) of no more than seven (7) days at a time.
